Innovation and sustainability have a long history, but they are still and increasingly central in the analysis of contemporary phenomena and in the design of future scenarios. On the one hand, social innovation concerns practices and processes capable of offering alternative solutions even to environmental and climate challenges. On the other hand, sustainability takes on economic, environmental and social dimensions, emphasising not only the need to think about an environmentally sustainable future but also the urgency of reflecting on the sustainability of innovative social processes over time.

The seminar series interweaves the two themes, without delineating a clear-cut boundary between the two, rather standing on their borders and **reflecting on how innovation and sustainability are inextricably intertwined**.

The series involves Italian and foreign experts in **social, political, administrative and organisational** topics, to offer a variety of theoretical approaches and empirical case studies.

The seminars are held in **English**, with a **blended** mode.
